allergic (adjective) uh-LUR-jik

allergic: a body's reaction to a harmless food, plant or substance when the immune system thinks it is harmful.

compassionate (adjective) kum-PA-shun-nut

compassionate: showing caring feelings or concern for others

culture (noun) KUL-cher

culture: the social habits, music, and art of a group of people

custom (noun) KUS-tum

custom: a way of doing something specific to a group of people or a certain time period

depleted (adjective) de-PLEET-ed

depleted: used up the supply of

design (noun) de-ZINE

design: a drawing to show how something is made or how it works

diverse (adjective) de-VERSE

diverse: showing many different kinds

fables (noun) FA-buls

fables: stories usually featuring animals to tell a story about how to live

gullies (noun) GU-leez

gullies: water-worn, narrow canyons

habitat (noun) HA-bi-tat

habitat: the natural home of an organism

indigenous (adjective) in-DI-je-nus

indigenous: native to a place

inhabit (verb) in-HA-bit

inhabit: occupy or live in

intuition (noun) in-too-I-shun

intuition: inner knowing

landscape (noun) LAND-scape

landscape: the view of the land from a distance

manufactured (adjective) man-yoo-FAK-shurd

manufactured: assembled from a combination of parts

native tongue (noun) NA-tiv TUNG

native tongue: the language first spoken in one's homeland

predators (noun) PRED-a-ters

predators: the creatures who hunt another creature

regional (adjective) REE-ju-nul

regional: relating to a particular place or part of the world

striving (verb) STY-ving

striving: trying hard

sympathetic (adjective) sym-pu-THET-ik

sympathetic: feeling sadness about someone else's pain

tolerant (adjective) TALL-er-unt

tolerant: accepting of others

topographical (adjective) top-o-GRAF-i-kul

topographical: related to the land forms or features on a map, such as mountains, valleys and bodies of water

tortoise (noun) TOR-tus

tortoise: a reptile with a shell; a turtle

universal (adjective) you-ni-VER-sul

universal: relating to all
