Unity Element 10: Unite with Your Stars

Think about the projects you have completed in this unit. Each person in your family or group offered something to make the work go smoothly, by helping others, by helping to create something, by joining in a game or making music or even giving a smile.

Think of one way that each person gave joy to others. Sit in a circle. (If you are online, start with the person whose name comes first in the alphabet.) The second person tells the first something they did to bring joy to others. The next one turns to the person on the left and repeats the process, until everyone has had a chance to thank the others for bringing joy and unity to the group.

Make a pledge with the people in your group or family to multiply this joy and send it out to everyone else in the human family.

A Sky filled with Unity

1. Remind the family of the astronomy lesson and poem.
2. Fold a piece of paper three times.
3. On one side, draw a diamond connecting each side of the paper.
With a scissor, trim away the portions outside the diamond.
4. Unfold the diamond to reveal a “constellation” of diamonds.
5. Each person will write the name of another on a diamond and write down one of their good qualities.
6. Tape or tack the paper to the wall, to symbolize the unity of the family at its best
